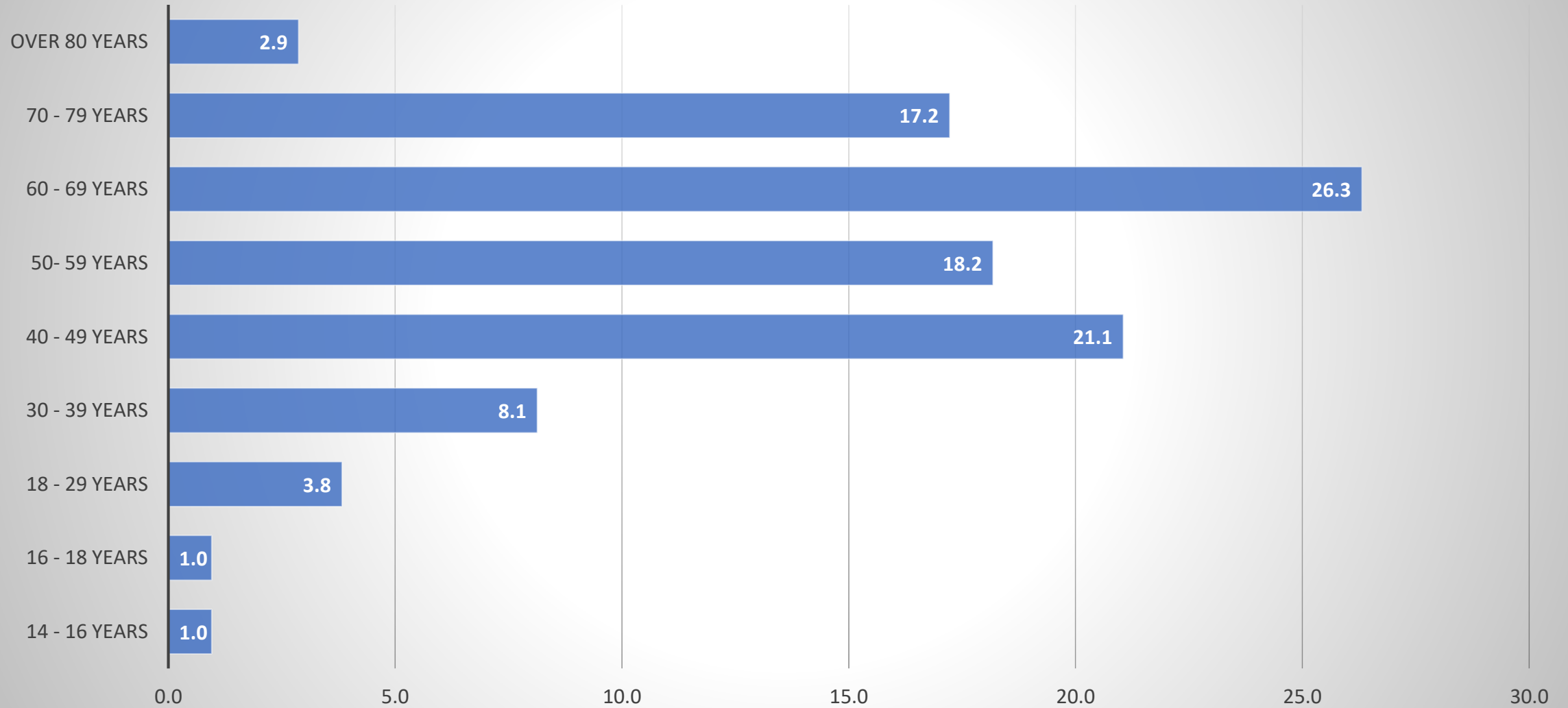

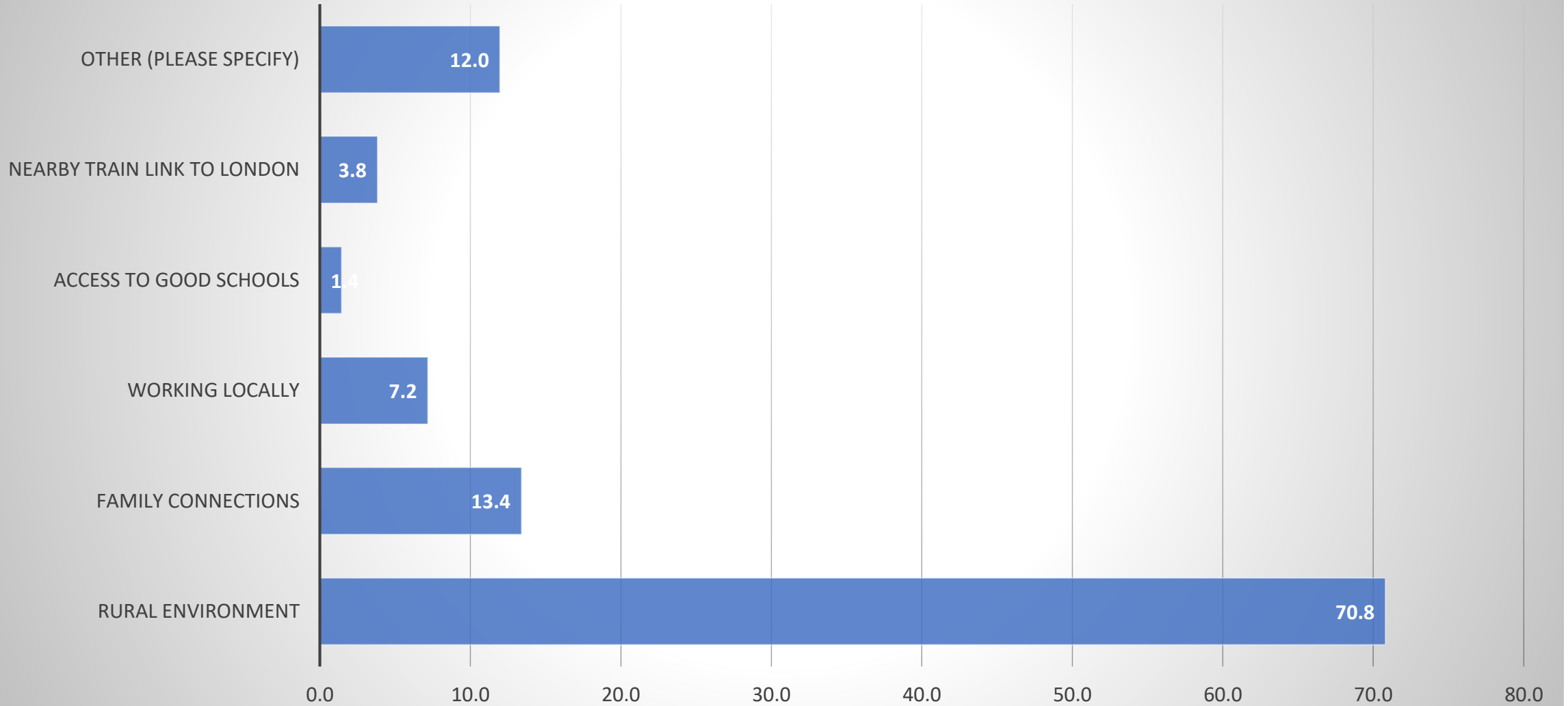
# General comments

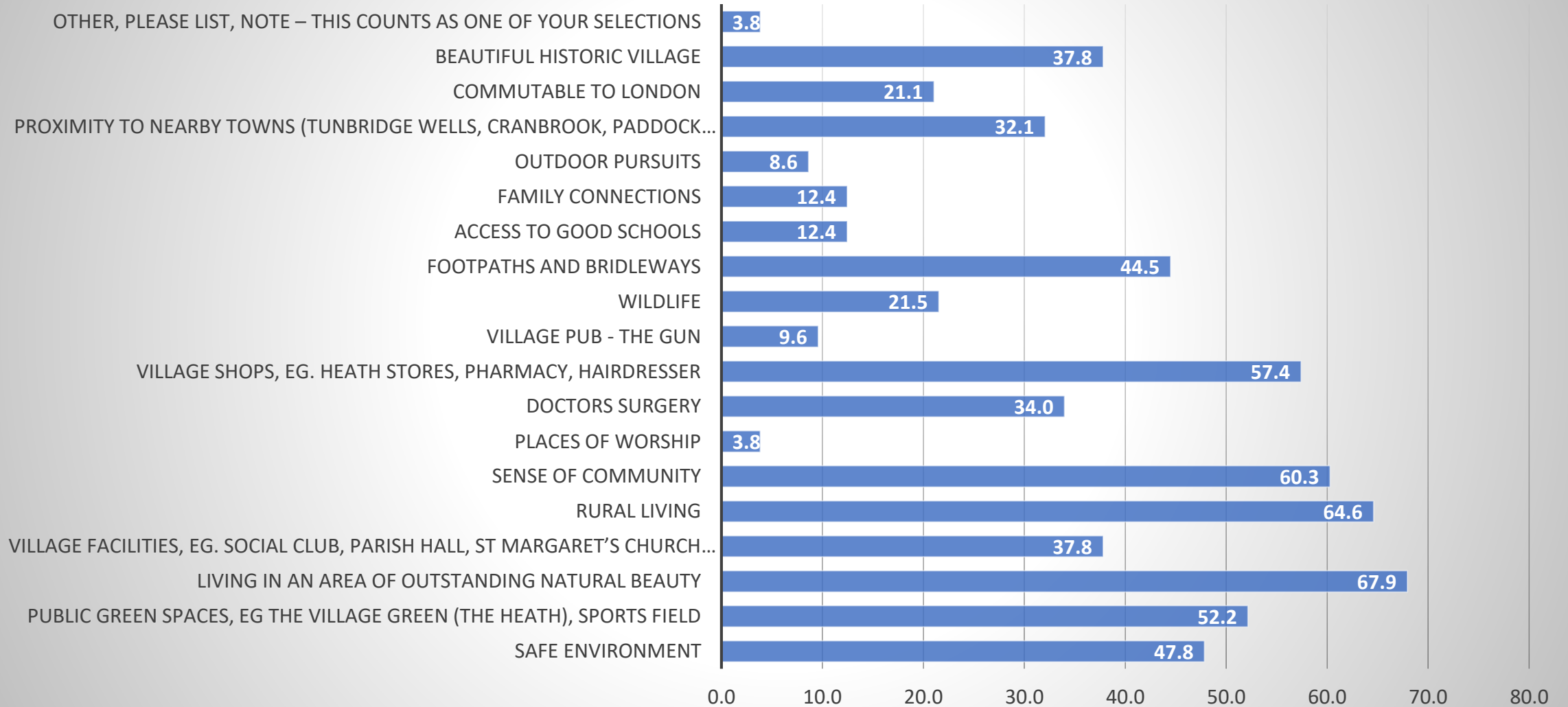
## Age of person completing questionnaire %



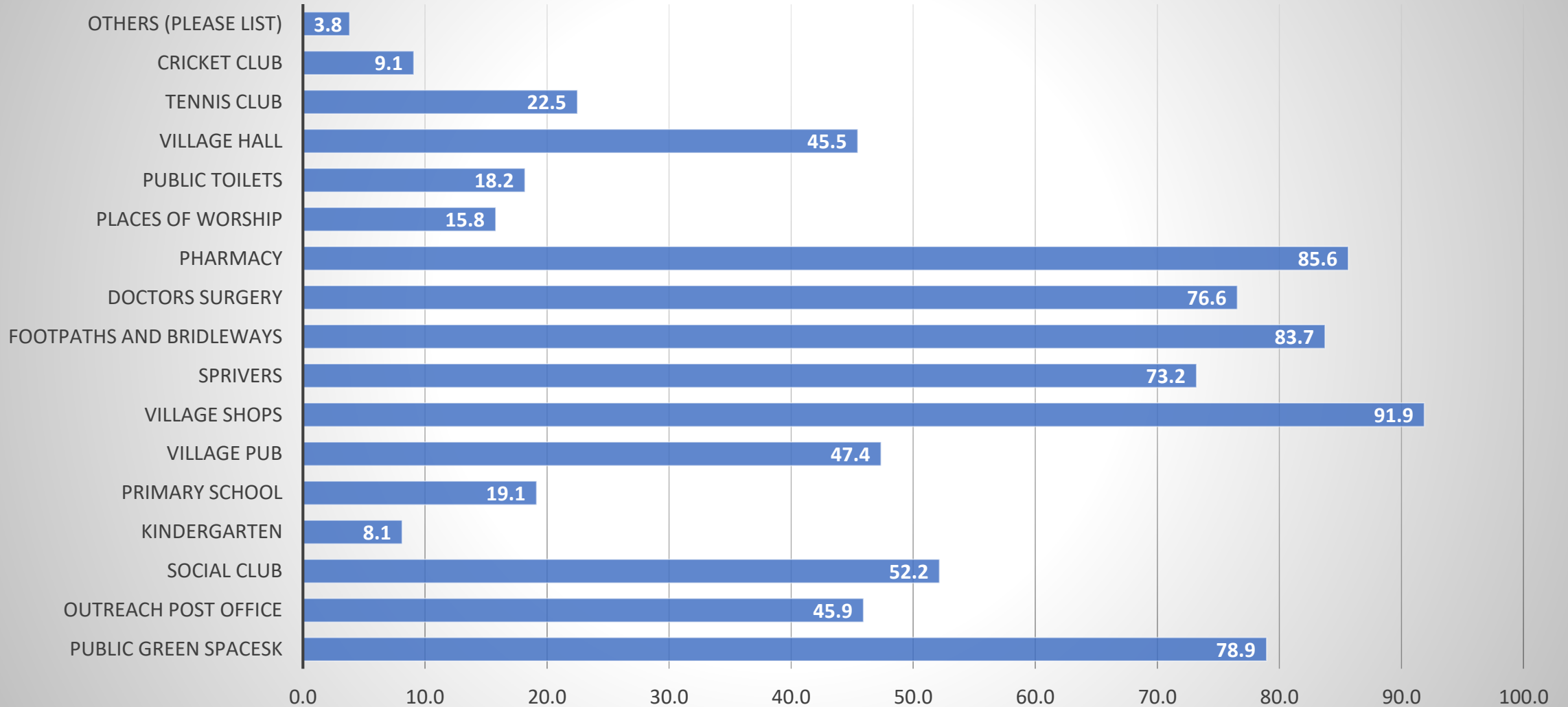
## Main reason for living here %



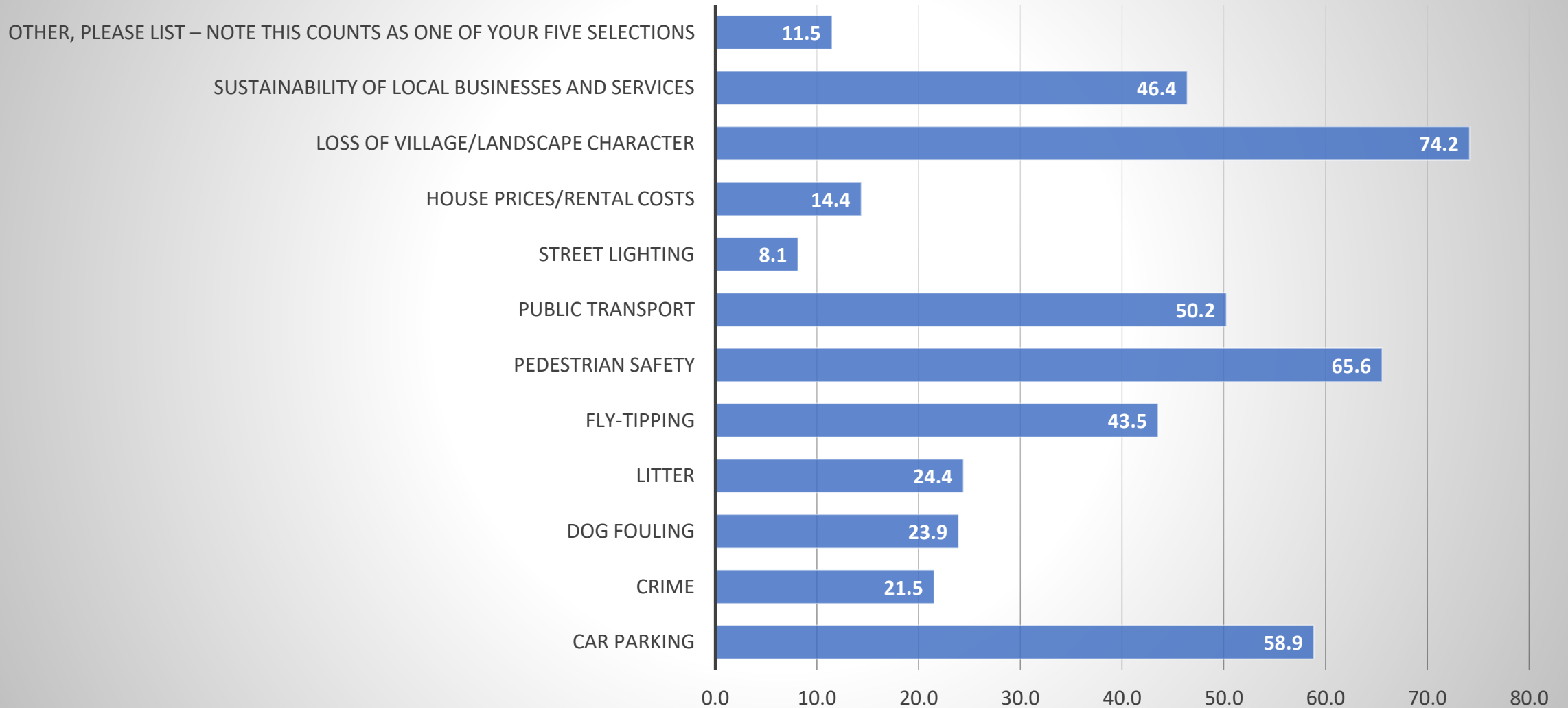
## What do you value most %



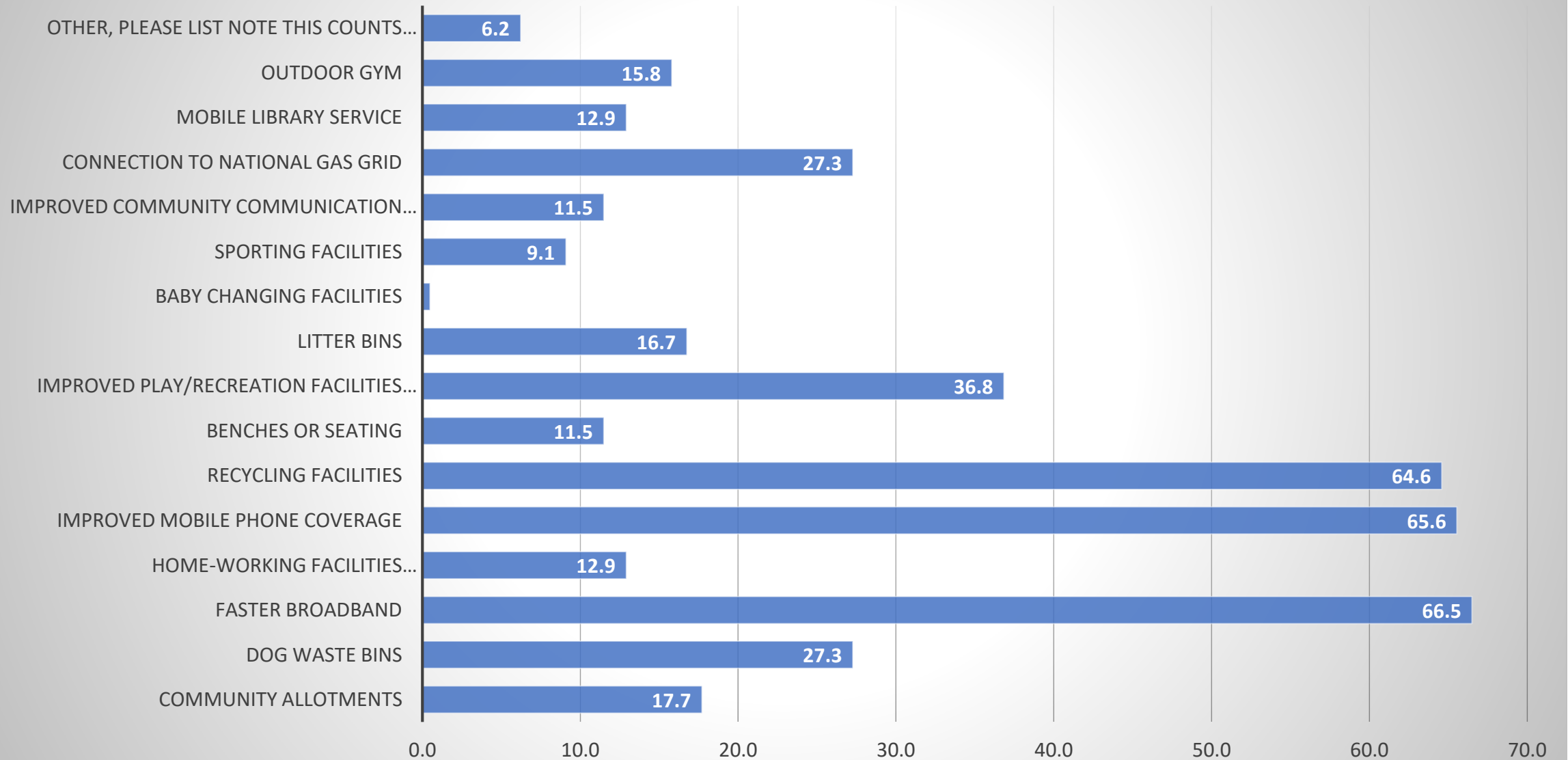
## Which amenities do you use?

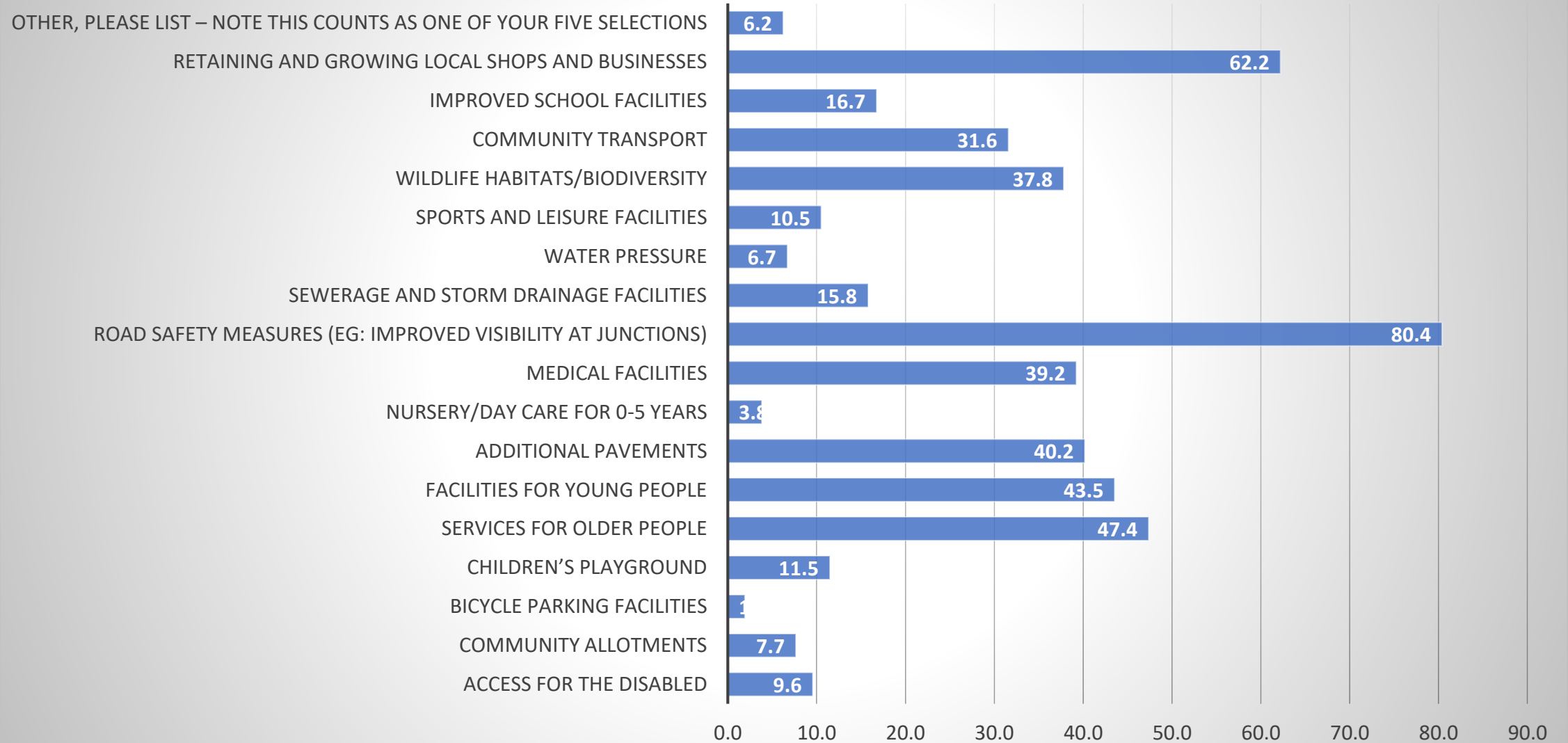

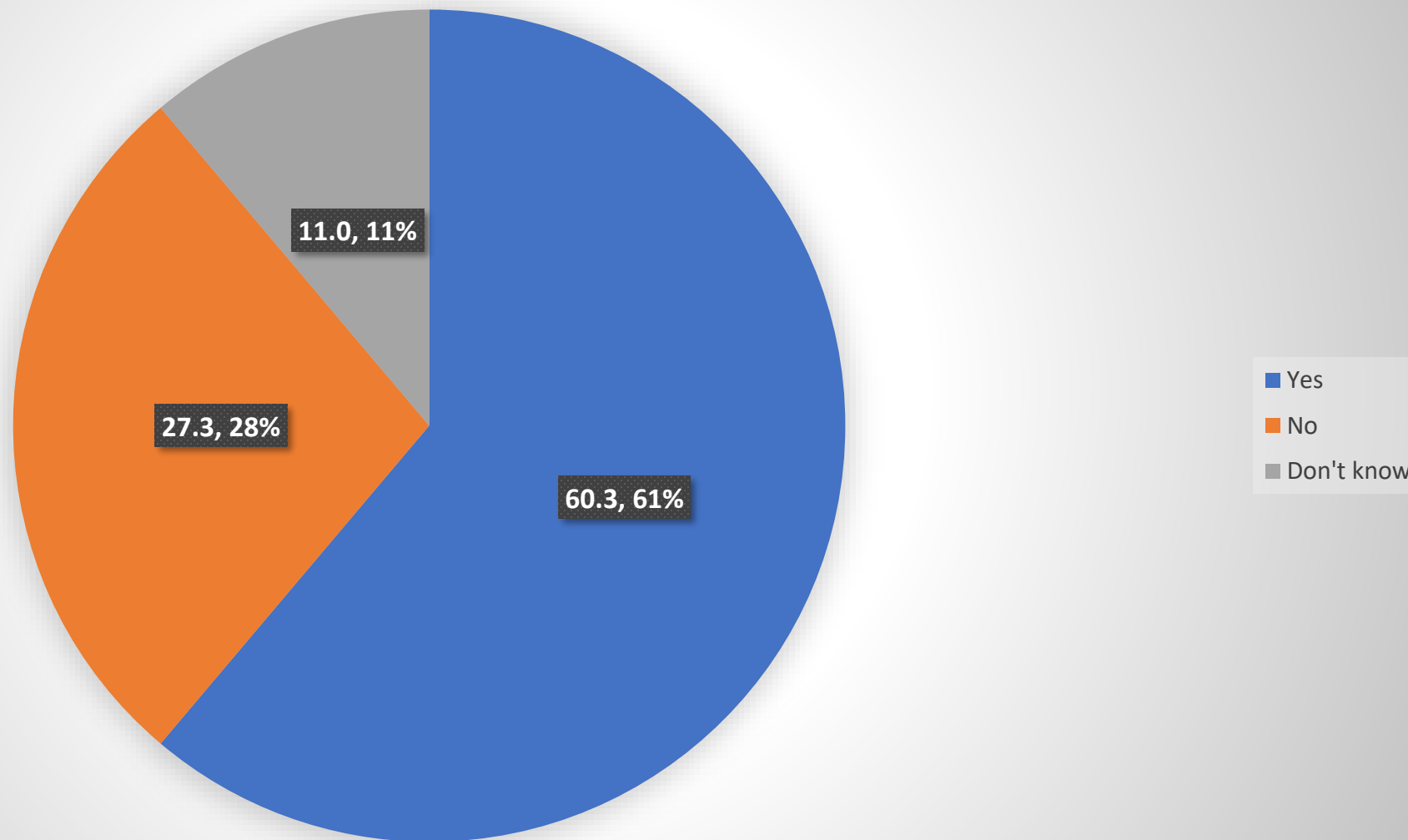




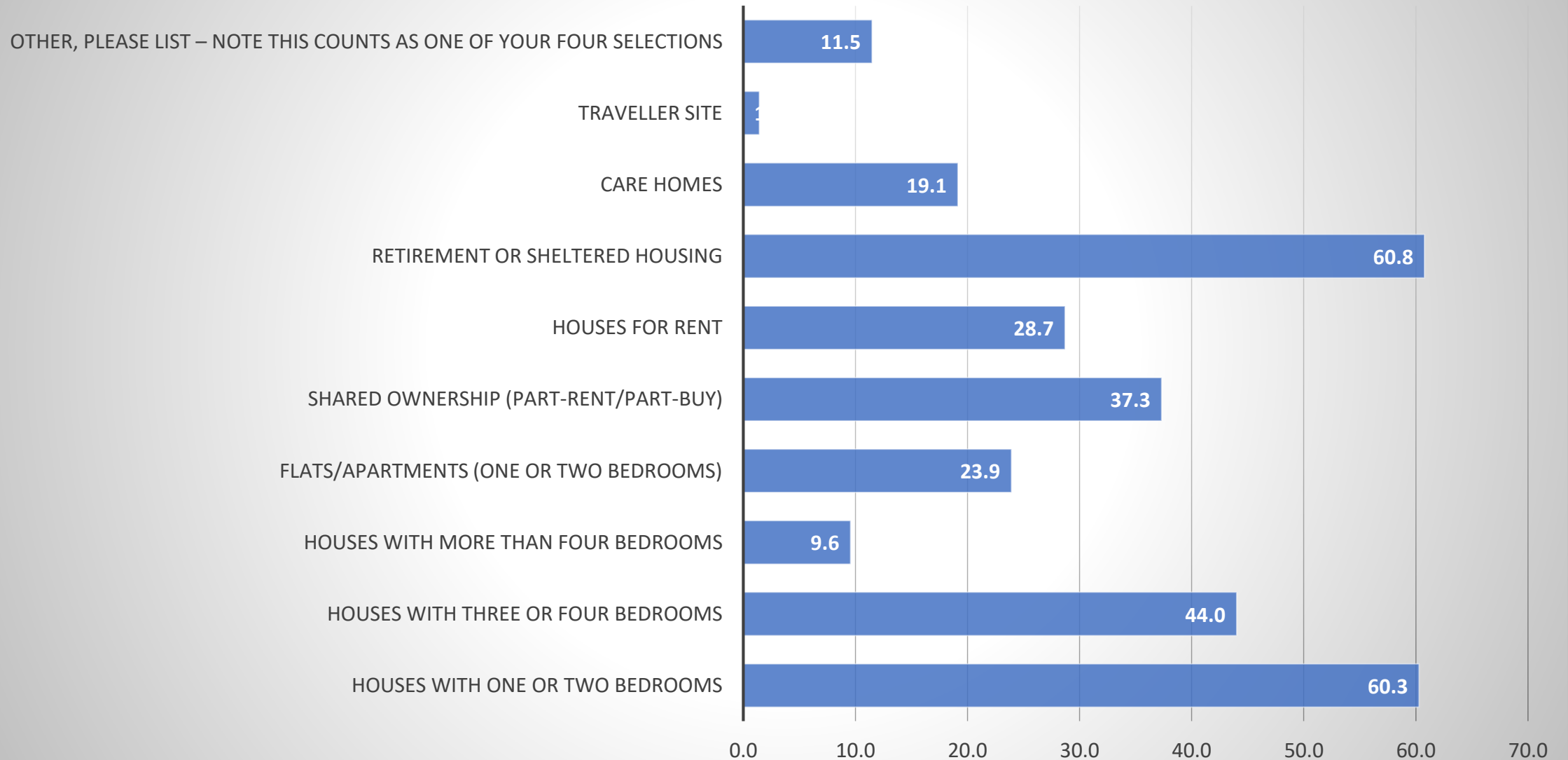

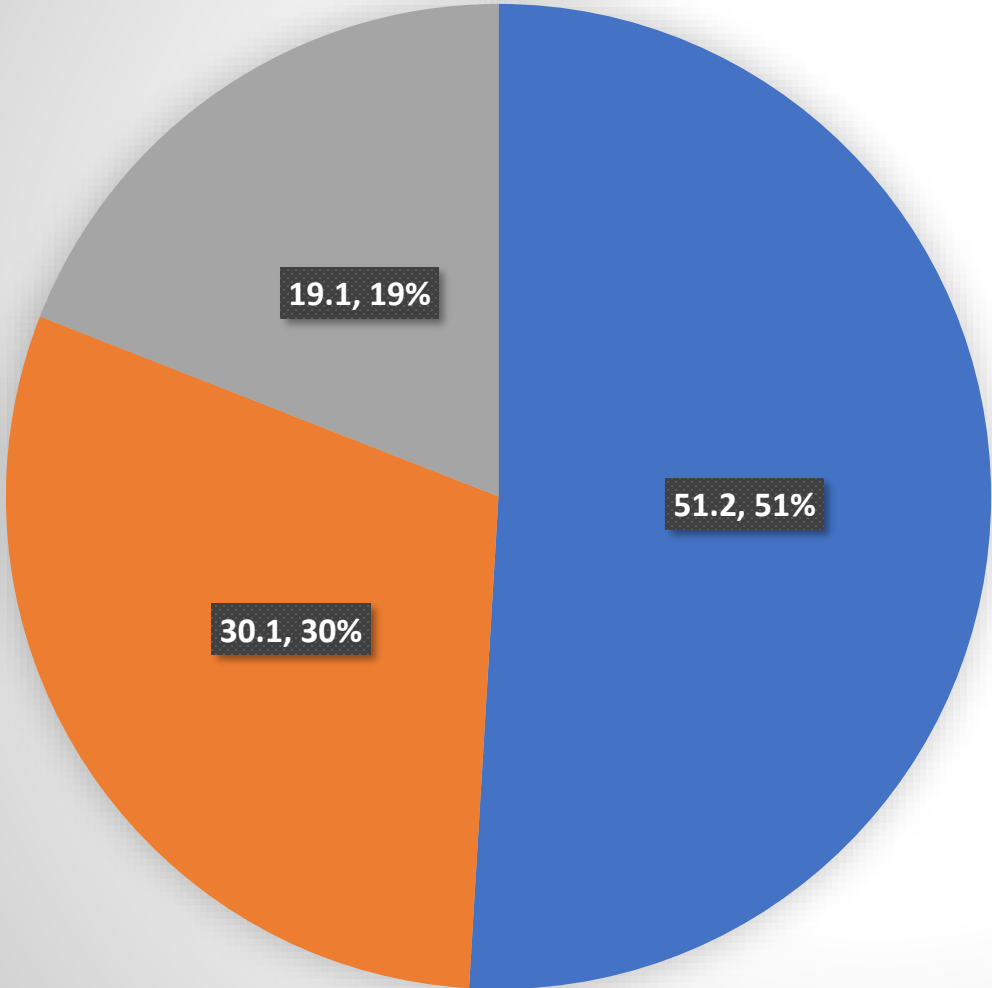
## Need for new homes in the parish?



## Types of new homes most needed %

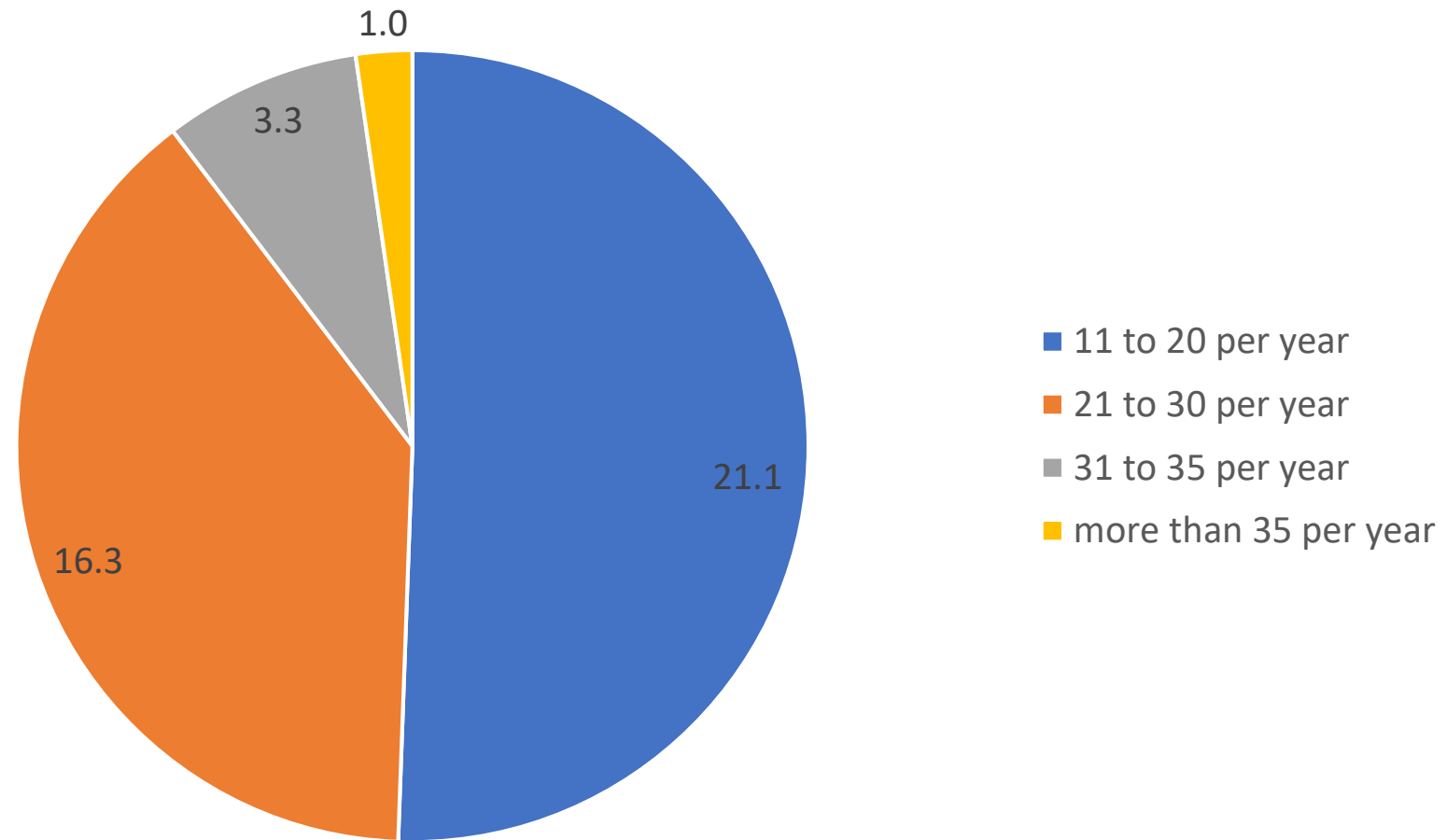


# What level of housing growth can the village absorb without losing its character %

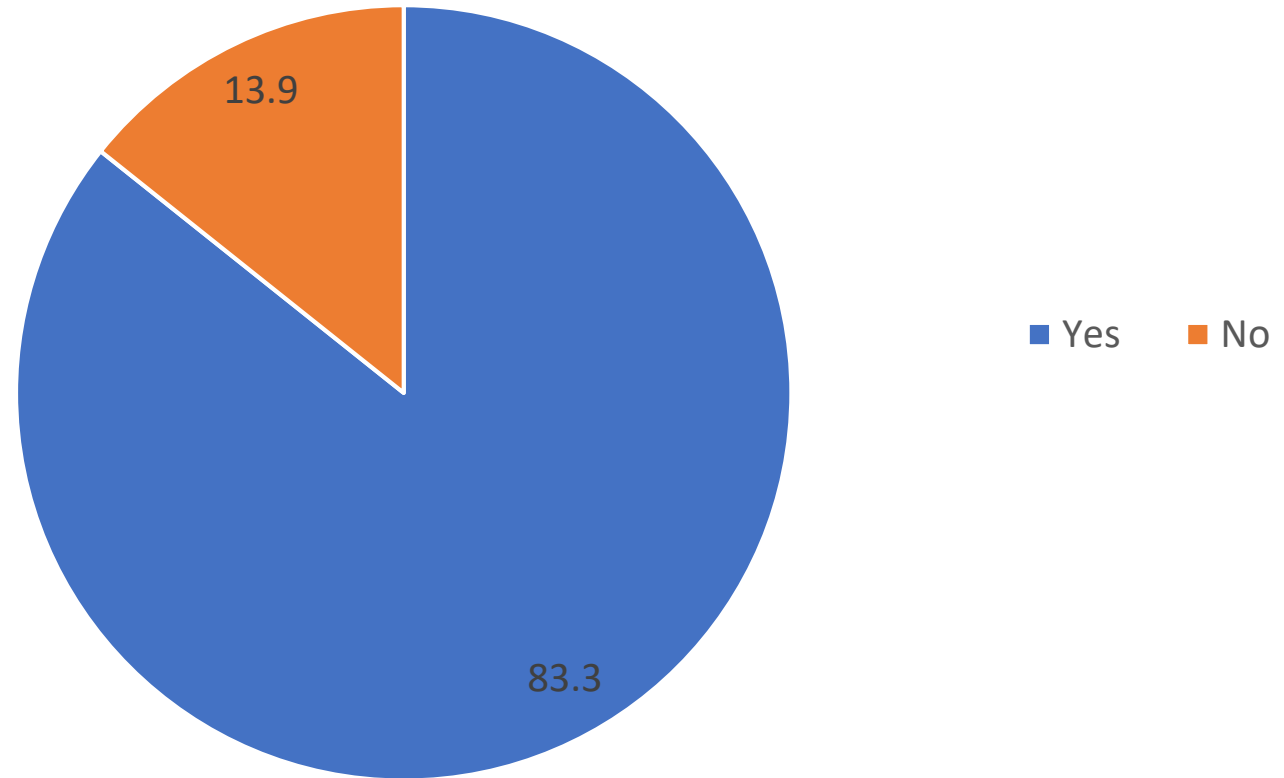


- About the same level of house-building as in previous years

- Less house-building than in previous years

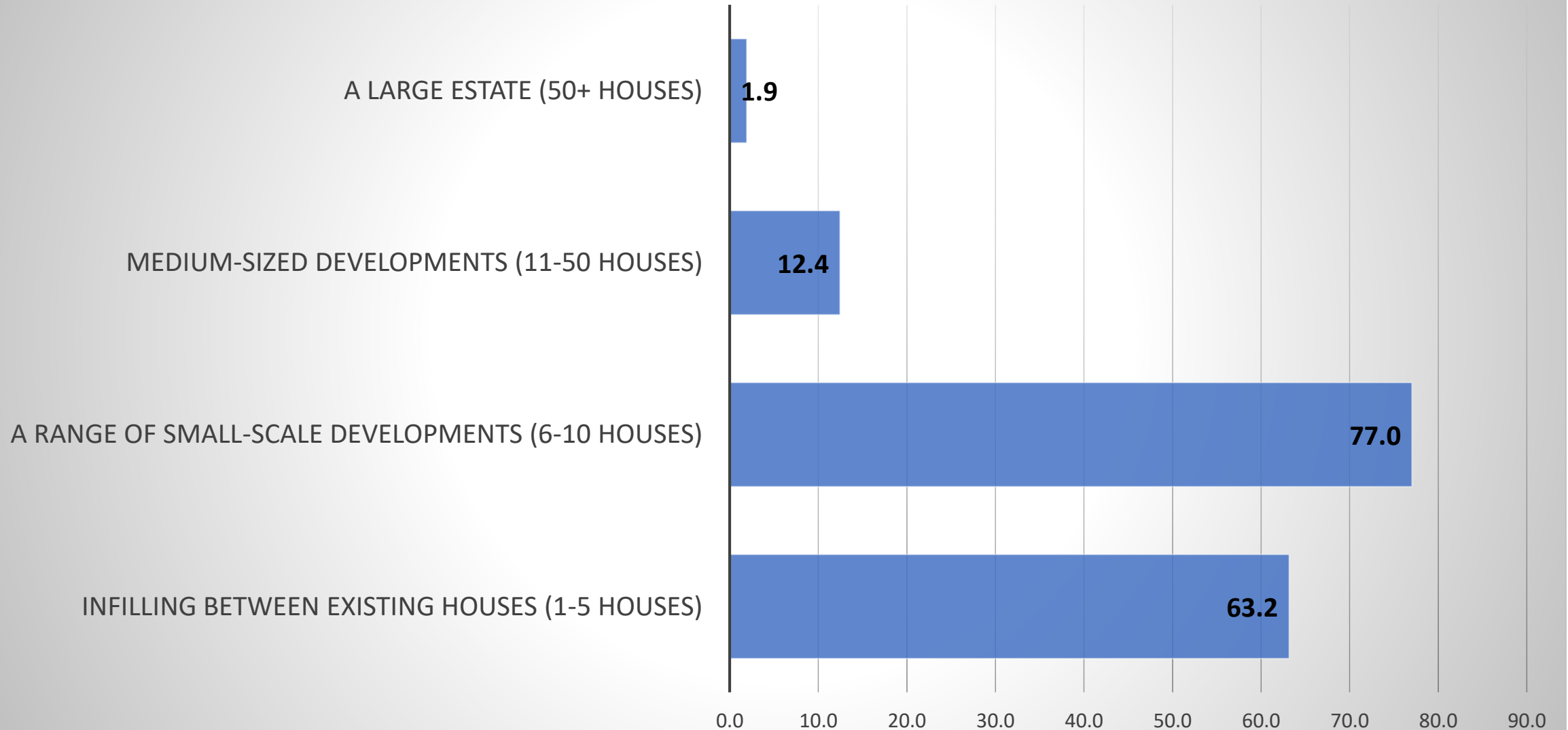
If you answered “More house-building than in previous years”, what would you consider to be the right number each year?



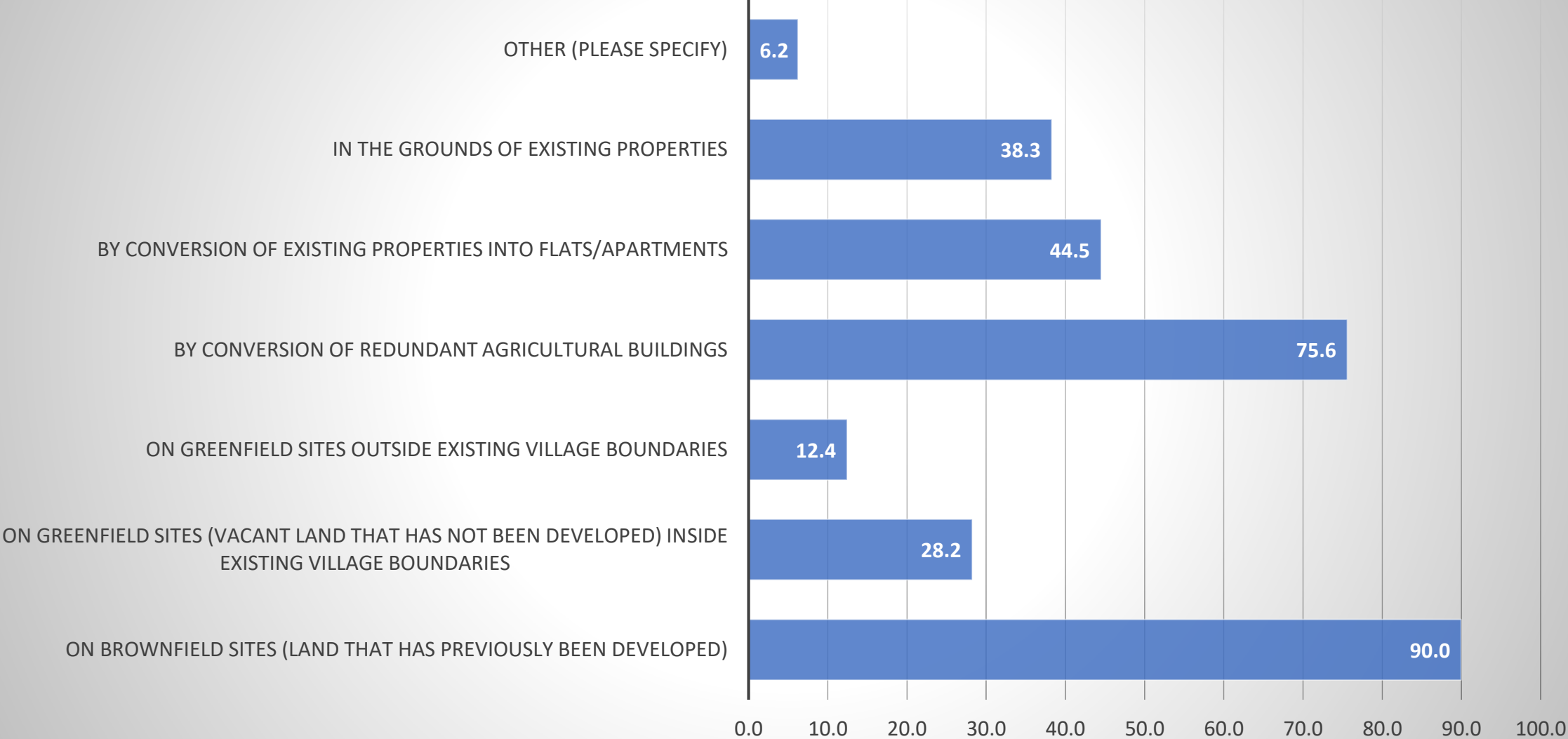
Would you support housing for people on low income with local connections?

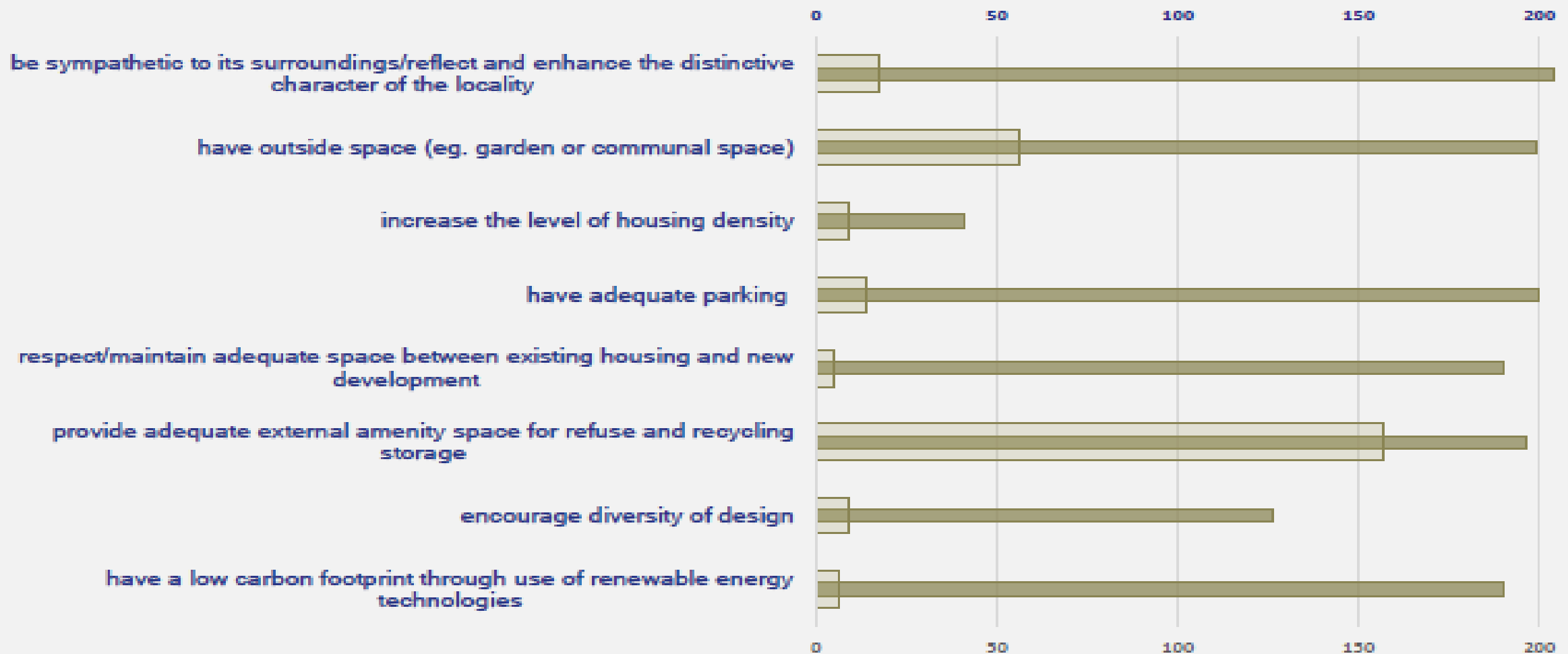

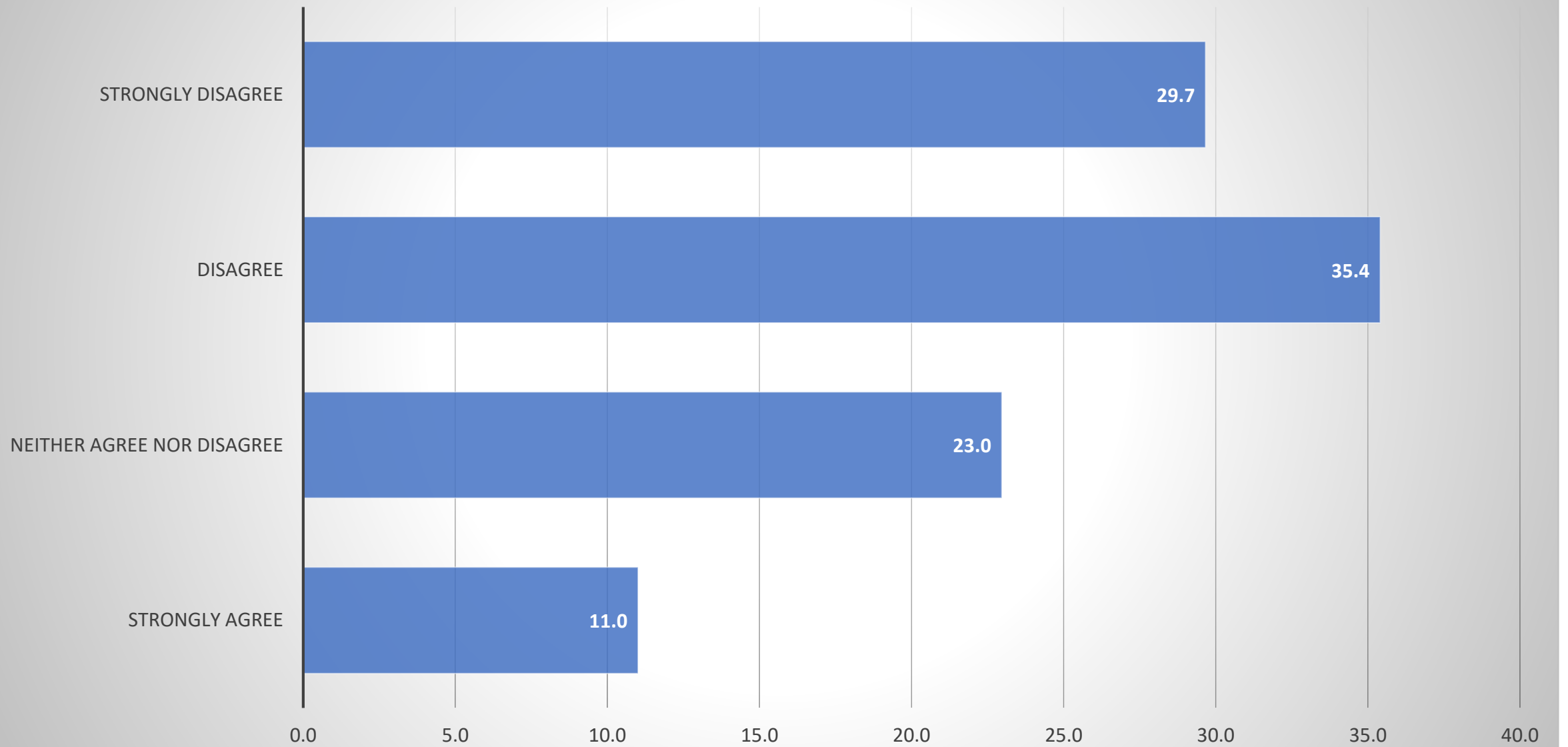

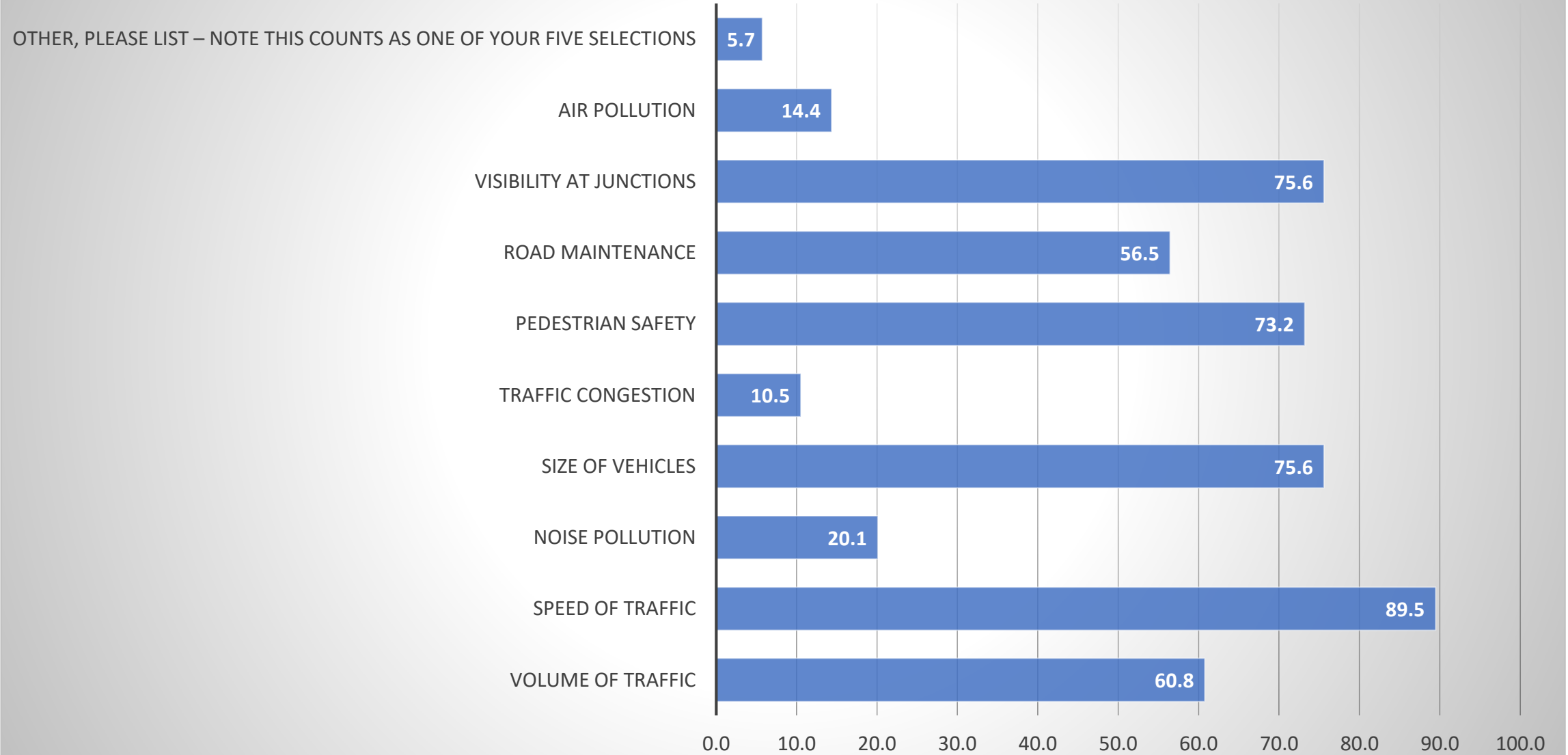

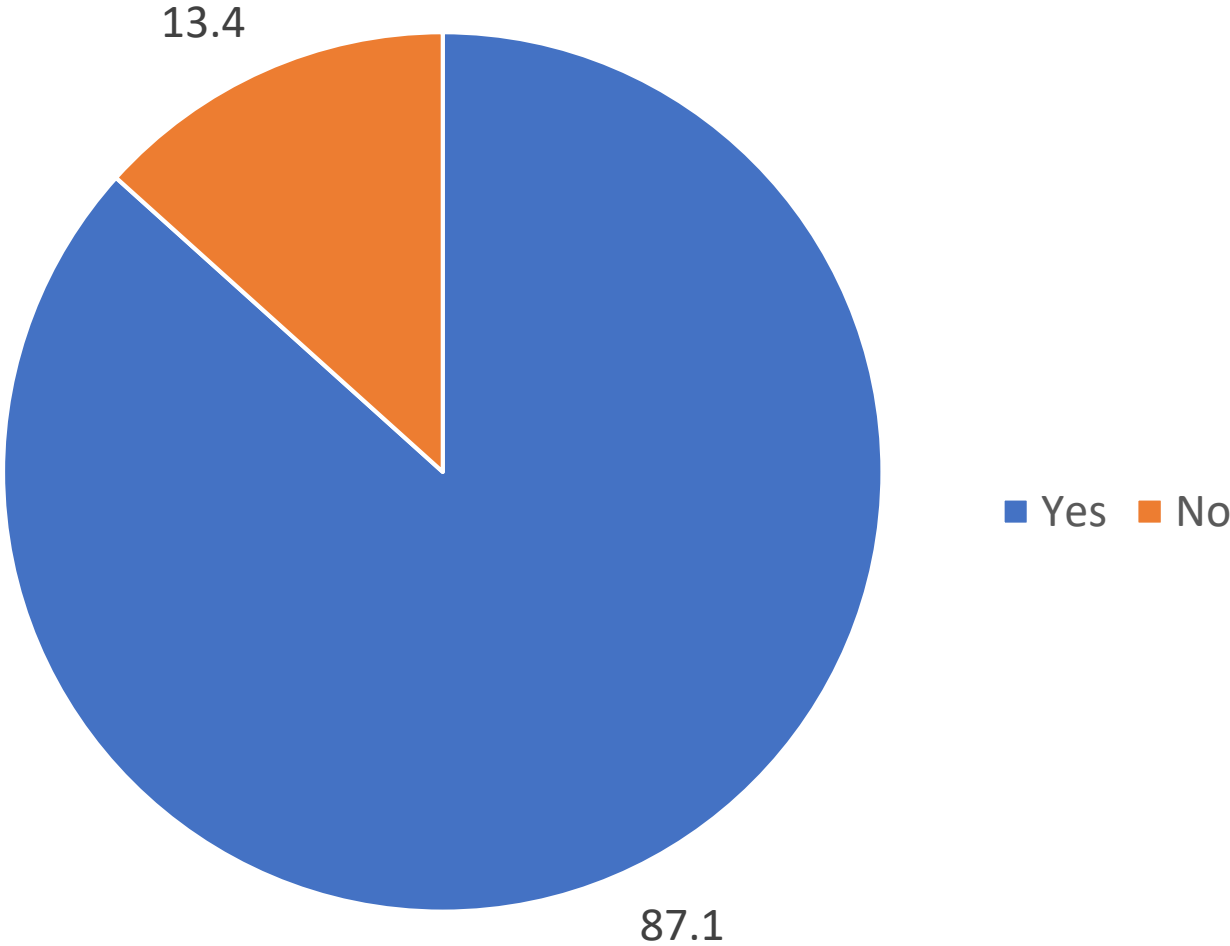
## Roads adequate for traffic ...



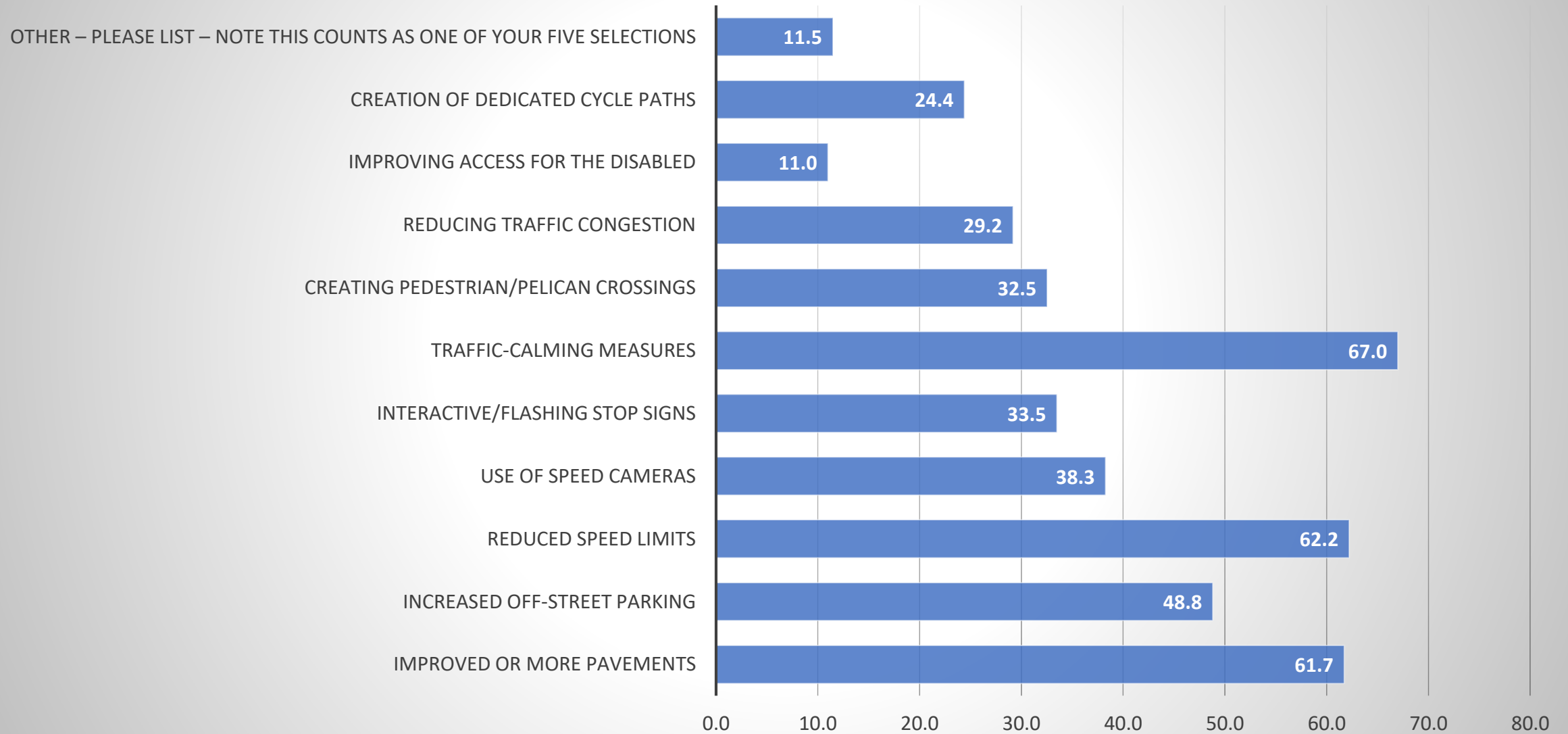
## Aspects of traffic you are concerned about?

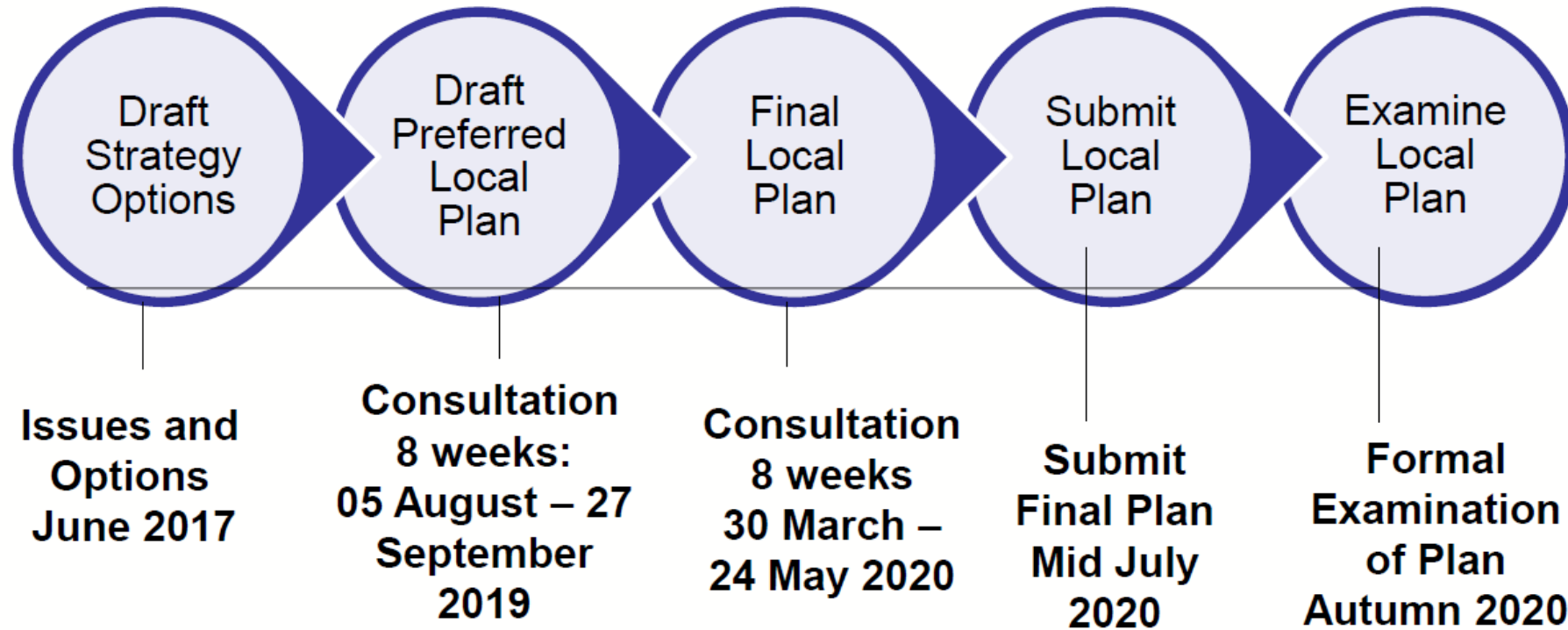

# TWBC Local Plan (Local Development Scheme)

The revised timescales are:

- To undertake consultation on a Draft Preferred Local Plan (Regulation 18) from August to September 2019: this is an 8 week (rather than 6 week) consultation period as it falls over the summer holiday period;
- To undertake consultation on a Pre-Submission Local Plan (Regulation 19) from March 2020 – May 2020; this is again an 8 week (rather than 6 week) consultation period as it falls over the Easter holiday period;
- To submit the plan in Autumn 2020.
